While struggling to find a new and interesting topic for this month's newsletter, Mother Nature dropped one right in my lap. Saturday (August 28), we had quite an electrical storm. Only $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of rain but lots of lightning for an extended period.


Lightning and golf courses do not mix well. Usually consisting of tall trees over a web of irrigation wires. We need to remember this as we harass the pro shop staff as to when and why we cannot continue playing. Lightning kills. There have already been two deaths in the United States due to lightning strikes on golf courses. Be aware of the weather forecast when going out to play golf at any course. When the horn blows, we need to evacuate the course immediately, head to the clubhouse or the shelter near Rock #15 tee, and use the shelter for human beings before golf carts. The management only has your safety in mind when keeping you off the golf course in these conditions.

How often does lightning actually hit our golf course you may ask? Some longer-term members may remember the storm that took the roof off the pavilion in July of 2011, which included lightning strikes (picture below).

Looking at the last four golf seasons at Rock Harbor and lightning strikes that did visible damage:


- Boulder #10 Green the willow tree was hit beside the cart path on 6/17/2019 (no picture)
- Boulder #11 Green ash tree was struck between the green and #17 tee 7/4/2019 (picture on insert, page 3)
- Pump house Burnt a hole in a 60 Horse Power Irrigation Pump Motor 8/2020 (no picture)
- Boulder #4 Irrigation box was hit and melted the surge protection 6/ 2021 (no picture)
- Rock #5 ash tree at 200 yards right side of fairway 8/9/2021 (see picture on insert page 4)
- Boulder #14-#15 Hickory tree hit and caught fire 8/28/2021 (see picture - right)
- Boulder #4 right of the blue tee Y shaped poplar hit and surge damaged a near-by irrigation controller 8/28/2021 (see pic-tures on insert page 4)

Seeing the damage lightning does to trees imagine what it would do to you and your golf carts.
