

The Green

Chris Dieter, Course Superintendent:

While you enjoy the great golf weather, we continue to charge on with keeping the course in acceptable conditions for you. The Fall season brings, as we all know, beautiful colors as the trees lose their leaves. We will be continuously blowing and vacuuming leaves to keep the course clear for everyone's enjoyment. Unfortunately, it only takes one leaf to hide a golf ball.

One of our main challenges during this time of the year is dealing with frost. Frost usually sets on the turf around sunrise. Our crew starts well before sunrise to get the course ready. Quite often, we have to pull the crew off the course because the frost forms after we begin working. When we have frost, the decision has to be made between holding golf play for the sake of mowing greens and other early morning maintenance or letting golfers out earlier on uncut greens and with the same pin position as the day before. I always like to have a fresh course each day, however, sometimes it is better not

to hold up play for an extra hour or more.

Two other cold weather decisions are:

- 1) When should we change to winter cups?
- 2) When do we winterize the irrigation system?

When the ground freezes, it is impossible to change cups in a timely manner, so we put three permanent cups in each green. Winterization of the irrigation system needs to be completed before pipes and sprinklers freeze but not while the greens still need water. We had one winter when we shut down the irrigation system too early, we had to use a water truck in November. We have also had sprinklers spread ice in colder temperatures.

A few more bunkers have been refurbished, Rock 13 (pictured on the back) and Boulder 16. The rock walls on Boulders 6 & 7 are finished and look awesome. We are currently doing some landscaping along these walls and around Boulder 11 green. Much to your dismay, I do like adding trees to highlight the golf course. Rock 17 white tee was leveled and sodded and will be open for play in the Spring.


